
# Textwriter Notes

From 'St. Patrick's Breastplate." A hymn celebrating the spiritual Presence of Christ in the life of the Christian, and stressing the need for the Christian to be another Christ in all he says and does.

It can be used as a hymn expressing the love of the Church for Christ, and is especially appropriate for Nuptial Mass: it then brings out the sacramental symbolism of marriage (cf. Ephesians 5:21–33).


